The Sonora Quintet, which was founded especially for the anniversary celebrations, accompanied the speeches with a Concerto in G major by Georg Philipp Telemann.

The exhibitions will also be touring the country and will be installed at various German-Malaysian institutions in Greater Kuala Lumpur and Penang in the coming months.

Finally, a huge birthday cake was brought in as a fitting tribute to mark the grand birthday of DSKL. Dr Stadie and Dr Mayer cut the giant cake, thus marking the end of the wonderful presentations and kicking off the festive social activities of this commemorative event. The festivities ended with much mingling and fun for the entire school community, who also enjoyed freshly made rotis, curry and satay skewers as well as a grand buffet. \square
