DaZ exercises for home: Speaking

(Status: November 2020)

- Speak German with your child as often as possible. This may sound very banal at first, but it is not. Even children who grow up only with German learn a lot in their language at Primary School age. It is enriched by specialized vocabulary, the sentences become more complex and the children are able to express themselves more precisely and in more detail.
- A real conversation with your child cannot be replaced by a worksheet. Talk about what
 the child has experienced, what he is interested in and what he is thinking about in
 German.
- It is also possible to talk to the child in German **about an English book or film** afterwards. This is actually very helpful because the child learns to express the same things in several languages.
- Children without German-speaking parents can tell their parents what happened in a German book or film. Maybe they will notice what they have not yet fully understood and watch the film again.
- Playing (puppet) theater
- Playing board games
- Karaoke singing/speaking with German lyrics
